

Farm Radios Increasing.

According to information received from the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Tennesseee now has 4,940 radios, an increase of 110 per cent over last year.

Radics are now quite common on Tennessee farms where daily weather and market reports of great value to the farmer are received.

The wide use of radios on the farm will make farm life more enjoyable since they wipe out the factors of isolation and distance from populous centers and put the farmer on an equality with the city man in providing instruction and entertainment during the long winter evenings.

Indeed the radio works better on the farm than in the city because of less interference.
